Action Items: Questions for the team to take to the Balanced Calendar Summit (10/12-13)

How could a balanced calendar support students who are working to provide/contribute to families? It would be helpful to survey students to find out what amount are working now, and when. A 4-day school week could improve student work availability, so could week-long breaks. Additional flexibility with work credit, Project-Based Learning.

What data are other districts using to measure student "summer slide"?

Doctoral studies by Hornal & Pederson. Some are trying to use FastBridge and told there "are reports" but no one has found which ones show cohort change.

Why would a balanced calendar be a benefit to students? Intersessions are what cause academic growth. Other benefits are mental health, food security, family flexibility, time to recharge, attracting more staff, stopping illness outbreaks.

Clear way to explain benefits of a change, with strategies of how to explain the change to community. How were changes explained to community? Local need, with lots of community input. Need everyone on board to be successful.

Are there other schools pursuing a balanced calendar on a secondary trimester schedule?
